

OFF PAPER? YOU CAN VOTE!

You can vote in Georgia if:

- You are not currently serving a sentence for a felony conviction
- You are “off paper”— you completed incarceration, parole, and probation
- You are serving a felony First Offender or Conditional Discharge sentence and the status has not been revoked



When your sentence is complete, your right to vote is *automatically* restored. You just need to re-register in order to vote.

Outstanding monetary obligations do *not* keep you from voting if your sentence is complete.



Register. It's your right. Your vote is your voice.

LONG PROBATION SENTENCE?

If you meet the following criteria, you may be eligible for **early termination** of your felony probation!

- 1 Completed 3 years of your probation sentence
- 2 No probation revocations in the past 24 months
- 3 No new arrests (other than non-serious traffic offenses)
- 4 Paid all restitution (not including fines and fees)



How to Access Early Termination

- 1 Contact your probation officer and request early termination if you meet the criteria
- 2 If you are still experiencing issues requesting early termination, reach out to DCS directly at early.termination@dcs.ga.gov
